

AYSO Area 1C Referee Points of Emphasis 19U and 16U Upper Division Play

- 1. These Points of Emphasis (POE) <u>do not</u> supersede the Area 1C Rules and Regulations. They are intended only to summarize and condense those rules for Upper Division Referees.
- 2. Any individual acting as a Referee or Assistant Referee is <u>required</u> to have a current AYSO Volunteer Registration (MY2024), Safe Haven (2012 or later), Concussion Awareness Training, Sudden Cardiac Arrest Training, LiveScan and SafeSport certifications on file with AYSO National. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 3. Qualifying referees are expected to complete a minimum of six (6) assignments during pool play. Referees will self-assign through CGI (https://cgisports.com/ref/6017/) with the exception of Boys 19U matches, requests for which should be emailed to Lorenz Glaza. Your ranking in CGI (set by Area) determines what games will be available to you for self-assign. If you want to see the entire schedule, go to the Team Standings public page (https://cgisports.com/ref/6017/stats/?user=public), select the division in which you are interested, and "search." Email Richard Chen to request these matches.
- 4. Each region hosting this season has a referee assignor. Contact information is attached, in the event of any field issues.

Pre-game Guidelines

- 5. The team listed first on the schedule <u>is</u> the home team which shall occupy the <u>north</u> or <u>west</u> side of the field, while the visiting team shall occupy the <u>south</u> or <u>east</u> side of the field. Referees may make exceptions to this rule but must report the exception in CGI along with the reason.
- 6. Spectators should occupy the same side of the field as the players, between the Penalty Areas and <u>at least 10-feet behind the touchline</u>. Certain fields do not have seating or space to accommodate this guideline, so Referees must use best judgment in enforcing this. If bleachers or grandstands are available, they <u>must</u> be used. <u>No one shall be behind the goal line</u>.
- 7. Home teams must have alternate jerseys or vests available in the event of a uniform conflict. Home team provides two balls, and visitors provide one.
- 8. Each team shall present a completed Lineup Card with <u>every team member's</u> full name and number. Make sure the Lineup cards are fully filled out.
- 9. Each team shall present ID cards for the coach, assistant coach, and every player and substitute. Acceptable Picture ID cards must be <u>laminated</u> with a <u>current</u>, age appropriate photograph attached. Any player, substitute, coach or assistant coach who does not submit a Picture ID card that complies with these rules shall not participate in that game. The sole exception is if you get word from either

- the Area Director (Rolando Morales, 323-823-4449) or the Area Coordinator (Peter Smock, 626-733-3014) that the person does not need an ID card for that game only---NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 10. Check-in is best accomplished with 2 people: one checks the ID cards (pictures, birthdates, etc.), and the other checks the lineup card. Both should be checking for proper uniform, shoes, shin guards, socks over, no jewelry, etc.
- 11. The Referee team shall retain the Photo ID cards of all players <u>and coaches</u> until the conclusion of the game.
- 12. A 10-minute grace period is permitted for getting the <u>minimum</u> number of players present. It is not meant to allow a team to achieve full strength prior to starting. Start the game <u>as soon as</u> the minimum numbers are on the field, ready to play.
- 13. If a game cannot be played due to insufficient players, lack of IDs, lack of authorized coach, etc., inform both coaches. In such a case, the entire Referee Team shall leave the field. Referees are <u>not</u> authorized to referee a "friendly/scrimmage" game. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Game Conduct

- 14. FIFA rules apply. 3-person Referee Team --- NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 15. Normal substitution is on the eighths, i.e. approximately every 11 minutes in 19U and every 10 minutes in 16U. Remind coaches to have substitutes going in ready before the whistle and to have players who are being substituted out to check in with you. Injury substitutions can occur at any time.
- 16. Every player should play one half of the game. No reduction of this requirement is allowed for players who arrive late. Report discrepancies on CGI and on the Lineup Card.
- 17. Only the Head and Assistant coaches with valid ID cards are permitted in the technical area.
- 18. If a <u>Head coach or Assistant Coach</u> is sent off during the game, the game is terminated immediately NO EXCEPTIONS. The Referee should report any coach sendoff or spectator ejection through the lineup card submission process within 24 hours.

Post-game Guidelines

- 19. Conduct a post-game handshake. If a coach asks to skip the handshake out of concern for potential incidents between the teams, the referee should honor that request.
- 20. Retain the ID card of any coach, assistant coach, player or substitute who was sent off. Return all others to the coach. Mail any retained ID cards to the Area Coordinator (Peter Smock, 393 Auburn Lane, Sierra Madre, CA 91024) within 24 hours.
- 21. Fill out the Lineup Cards <u>completely</u>, noting the final score, any misconduct, injuries, spectator misbehavior, ID card issues, and/or referee absences.
- 22. Within 24 hours, scan the QR code on the lineup card (https://ayso13.org/gcud), provide the prompted information (which will include questions on coach and spectator misconduct and serious injuries), and submit photos (front and back) of each lineup card, as directed.
- 23. You will then be redirected to the CGI site where you will log in and submit the balance of your report. Provide the prompted information (score, player or substitute misconduct and any comments not provided elsewhere). When describing the misconduct, please include the time, player number, name, and nature of the misconduct (e.g., "60', Pasadena #15, Mia Hamm, cautioned for USB, reckless tackle.")
- 24. Retain the lineup cards for the duration of the season (plan on December 1) in case of questions.
